- Q1. Talk about points of interest from the sermon or text of this past Sunday. What did you enjoy? What bothered you about the message? What did you learn that was new? Was there a highlight for you?
- Q2. If you had to summarize the theme/subject of the message - what would it be?
- Q3. If Nahum is like the second chapter in the story of Nineveh, what book is the first? How does knowing that these two are tied together help your understanding of the story?
- Q4. Having read Jonah, and now looking at Nahum, what kind of a reputation does Nineveh have? What other countries in the history of the world have had terrible reputations?
- Q5. Does history repeat itself? What lessons can we learn from the history of Nineveh? Is our country - Canada, anything like Nineveh? What about other western nations?
- Q6. Take a look at the attributes of God that Nahum uses. Try and put the various attributes in order of most "palatable" to least. (which ones do we like the most, versus which ones do we have the hardest time understanding)
- Q7. When Jonah preached to the people of Nineveh, they repented. By the time of Nahum, the people had long ago turned away from God. How does that happen? How is that one generation seeks after God and two to three generations later that faith is gone? What are some of the reasons that our children fail to embrace our faith? What things can we do to pass our faith on to our children?
