Q1. Talk about points of interest from the sermon or text of this past Sunday. What did you enjoy? What bothered you about the message? What did you learn that was new? Was there a highlight for you?

Q2. If you had to summarize the theme/subject of the message - what would it be?

Q3. What do you miss most about gathering together with the Church? Do you long to be together with the Church? Why or why not?

Q4. How could you do a better job of “identifying with Christ”?

Q5. In which ways do you currently share with others? What could you do to improve?

Q6. Do you know anyone who is sick, lonely, or feels out of place? How could you help them? In what ways could you walk with them in their journey?

Q7. Have you ever had someone help you by identifying sin in your life? Was it done well or was it done poorly?

Q8. For each of the following elaborate on what it means with respect to confronting sin in the lives of others.

- a. Do you have all the right facts
- b. Are you the right person? Who is?
- c. When is the right time to confront?
- d. What kind of language is required? What kind of body language?
- e. What else might be needed to do this right?

Q9. When people have spent time with you, do they walk away feeling “full of courage”? How could we change the way we relate to others so that they do walk away encouraged?
